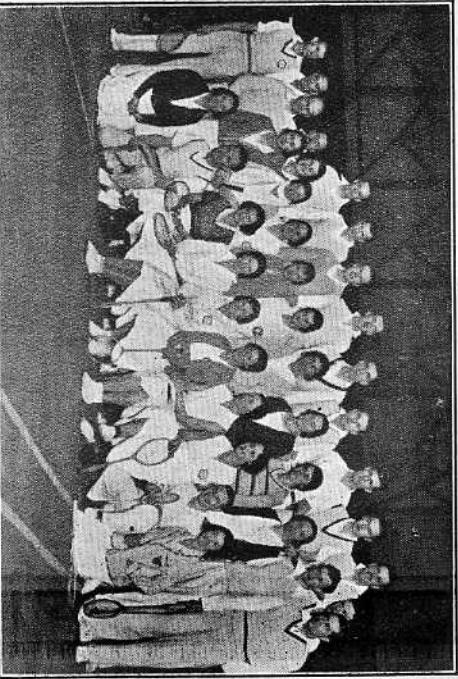

Extracts from the Rules of Badminton for the guidance of players.

The server and the player served to must stand within the limits of their respective half courts (as bounded by the short and long service, the central and side lines), and some part of both feet must remain in contact with the ground until the service is delivered.

It is a fault (a) If the service is overhand. (A service shall be deemed to be overhand, within the meaning of this law, if the shuttle at the instant of being struck be higher than the server's waist, or if any part of the head of the racket, at the instant of striking the shuttle, is higher than the server's hand holding the racket).

(c) If the server's feet are not in the half court from which service is at the time being in order, or if the feet of the player taking the service are not in the half court into which service is at the time being in order (*vide* Law 15) until the service is delivered.

Note (1)—A "service" is delivered as soon as the shuttle is struck by the server's racket.

Note (2)—A foot on the line is out of court.

(g) If when the shuttle is "in play" a player touch the net or its supports with racket, person, or dress.

KNOTTY POINTS.

If A is serving to B and the shuttle strikes

or is struck by B's partner, even if he is standing outside the court, A scores an ace.

A player who strikes the shuttle in play (unless he thereby makes a good return), or is struck by it, loses the stroke, no matter whether he is standing within the boundaries of the court or outside them.

COURTS.

The Court shall be laid as in Rules and defined by white or black lines $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide.

Where space does not permit of the marking out of a full-size Court in accordance with Rules, a Court may be marked out for Singles play only.

KNOCK-OUT COMPETITION.

RULES.

- (1) The draw for the first round will contain all Clubs in the League's membership; the ties to be played at the Courts of the first named Club or elsewhere by mutual agreement between the Clubs.
- (2) Home Clubs shall offer opponents two dates within the stipulated date for the tie. Failure to offer two such dates or failure to accept one of these dates will result in disqualification.
- (3) Each team will consist of ten players and each tie of two mixed doubles, one Ladies doubles, one Gent.'s doubles, one Ladies and one Gent.'s singles, each game to be a rubber.

CONSTITUTION AND RULES.

1.—The League shall be called "The Glasgow and District Churches' Badminton League." All Churches and kindred Associations shall be eligible for membership. The Annual Subscription of each Club shall be ten shillings (10/-) payable not later than the 31st July.

2.—The objects of the League shall be to foster and encourage the game of Badminton, and to do everything necessary or desirable for the promotion of the interests of the game among Christian Agencies.

3.—The League shall be managed by an Executive Committee, which shall consist of two representatives of each Club in membership of the League.

4.—The following Office-Bearers shall be elected annually:—Hon. President, President, Secretary, and Treasurer, not necessarily representatives of the Clubs in the League.

5.—The following Office-Bearers shall be elected annually from the Executive Committee:—Vice-President, Assistant Secretary, and Tournament Secretary.

6.—On the recommendation of the Office-Bearers Hon. Life Members may be elected at the A.G.M.

7.—The President be only eligible to hold office for three sessions.

8.—A Standing Committee shall be elected annually to select teams for representative matches.

9.—At the A.G.M. of the League, which shall be held in the month of May, alterations to the Constitution and Rules shall be considered, provided fourteen days' notice has been given to the Secretary. A two-thirds' majority shall carry a motion, each Club shall only have two votes on all matters, and the Chairman shall have a casting vote, or at a specially summoned meeting, provided 14 days' notice has been given to all Clubs.

10.—The Balance sheet presented at the A.G.M. by the Treasurer shall have been passed by the Auditors, who shall be elected annually.

11.—The Executive Committee shall conduct all business of the League. It shall have power to deal with any player or Club violating the Rules. Members of the Committee shall retire if their Clubs are involved, but they shall be entitled to be heard on the subject; fifteen shall form a quorum provided each Division be represented, and a bare majority shall carry a motion.

12.—Each Club shall play home and away matches with every Club in their Division except as in Rule 36. Points shall be awarded as follows:—Two points for a win, one point for a draw.

13.—All matches must be for four couples mixed doubles, and to be played as in American Tournaments, each couple to play one game of fifteen aces (all games to change at eight aces) with each couple of the opponents. If after two and a half hours play the game is unfinished the result of the games played will be taken as the final score, and points awarded accordingly, but should the home Club receive an extension of time, the Clubs can by mutual agreement complete the games.

14.—Clubs failing to play as in Rule 11 lose the points, and defaulting Club be held liable for half expenses; the maximum half expenses to be four shillings.

15.—All matches shall be played according to the laws of the game as approved by the Scottish Badminton Union, with the exception that the minimum size of the court be 40 ft. in length and 18 ft. 6 ins. in breadth.

16.—In the event of Clubs tying for the League Championship or for relegation, games will determine the positions, and in the event of games being equal aces will

determine the positions.

17.—Two Clubs will be promoted and two relegated; this to apply to the respective Divisions.

18.—All players taking part in League Competitions must be registered three clear days before playing in same. No registration form will be accepted unless accompanied by a fee of sixpence; registrations are valid for one season.

19.—The home and away Clubs shall each have an Umpire who shall umpire the games. Linesmen are essential for each game. The Clubs to make their own arrangements regarding same.

20.—Play in all matches must commence not later than thirty minutes after recognised starting time. Clubs failing to observe will forfeit the points.

21.—In all League matches the Secretary of the Home Club must complete the score sheet and return same to the Assistant Secretary not later than two days after the match.

22.—League fixtures can only be altered with the sanction of the League Secretary, provided seven days' notice has been given, stating reasons. In cases of emergency, where seven days' notice has been found im-

possible, a written statement from the Management of the Church, stating that the hall is not available, will be deemed sufficient reason for the postponement of the fixture.

23.—Any Club playing a player under an assumed name, an unregistered player, or an ineligible player, will lose the game and be fined two points in addition.

24.—(a) A player taking part in two matches for a Club in this League shall be bound to that Club unless officially transferred.

(b) No Club shall sign a player of another Club, who has played in two games for that Club, unless the said Club agree to transfer. In transfer an official form must be used.

(c) All transfers must meet with the approval of the Executive Committee.

(d) No player be transferred after 31st December of each playing season.

25.—No players can be registered after 31st January each playing season.

26.—The home Club must provide four regulation shuttlecocks; if a less number than this is provided, and the Umpire considers that they are unplayable, and the game cannot go on, the home Club loses both points.

27.—All League games must commence not later than two and a half hours before the recognised closing time of the hall.

28.—Should any question arise which is not provided for by the Constitution and Rules, the Committee shall have power to determine same.

29.—On a requisition signed by half the representatives of the Clubs in the League a special meeting must be called.

30.—In the event of a Club failing to fulfil an arranged League fixture without the sanction of the League Secretary, such Club shall be held liable for expenses. The Committee shall have power to inflict a fine on Clubs failing to fulfil their arranged fixtures.

31.—A Committee of seven (with powers to add further members if desired) shall be elected annually to make all arrangements for tournaments and to be responsible for carrying through same.

32.—The President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be *ex-officio* members of all committees.

33.—The names and addresses of Match Secretary, two League representatives, and location of hall shall be notified in writing to the League Secretary with the payment of annual subscription. Any change in above should be intimated at once.

34.—That a handbook be published with the Constitution and Rules, League fixtures, etc., each Club to be responsible for twelve copies

of same.

35.—The Secretary of home Club must write Secretaries of visiting Clubs, who must receive notice not later than three clear days before the match, explaining the location of the hall and the best way of reaching same.

36.—Where the Divisions consist of eleven Clubs each Club will play each other once, each Club having five home and five away fixtures, which will be balloted.

Recommendation.

The Executive Committee of the League recommends that each Club have a copy of the laws of the game, as approved by the Scottish Badminton Union, in their hall on the nights of the matches.

Postal Orders sent in payment of Registration and Tournament Fees, Dance Tickets, etc., should be made payable to Glasgow and District Churches' Badminton League and crossed "& Co."

The Executive Committee will meet in the Alexandra Parade Methodist Halls, Millburn Street, at Alexandra Parade, on the second Friday of each month, October till May, at 7-45 p.m. prompt. Clubs will be notified of any change in this arrangement.
