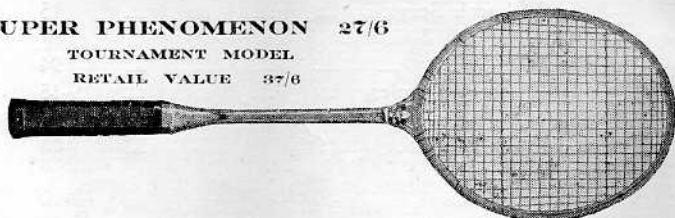

A Message from our Hon. President.

Once again summer (if it has any right to be called by such a name) is nearly over, and our thoughts turn to our winter recreation with renewed interest and keenness. Mr. Swan has the winter's programme well in hand, and we can look forward with eager anticipation to the various tournaments and matches which are being arranged. The first thing will be for our players to get in some steady practice, and I hope that a great effort will be made this session to lower Edinburgh's colours; whatever the result, the playing of the game is what matters, and it will be a great tussle.

With the holiday season past also, the churches to which we belong will be commencing their winter's activities, and in sending greetings to all our players I feel sure they will not only play Badminton but also play their part in the life and work of the church. The Master whom we are trying to follow needs youth to carry on His work. Let us dedicate our youth and strength to His service. With every good wish for a happy and successful session to all clubs in the League.

J. A. MARTIN, *Hon. Pres.*

1.—The League shall be called “The Glasgow and District Churches’ Badminton League.” All Churches and kindred Associations shall be eligible for membership. The Annual Subscription of each Club shall be ten shillings (10/-) and Reserve Team (2/6), payable not later than the 31st July.

2.—The objects of the League shall be to foster and encourage the game of Badminton, and to do everything necessary or desirable for the promotion of the interests of the game among Christian Agencies.

3 (a)—The League shall be managed by an Executive Committee, which shall consist of Hon. President, President, Secretary, Treasurer, and two representatives of each Club in membership of the League.

(b)—Clubs failing to be represented at the Executive Committee meetings shall be fined one shilling for the first offence, and two shillings for every other Executive Committee meeting at which they are not represented during the season.

4.—The following Office-Bearers shall be elected annually:—Hon. President, President, Secretary, and Treasurer, not necessarily representatives of the Clubs in the League.

5.—The following Office-Bearers shall be elected annually from the Executive Committee:—Vice-President, Assistant Secretary, Tournament Secretary, and Reserve Division Secretary.

6.—On the recommendation of the Office-Bearers, Hon. Life Members may be elected at the A.G.M.

7.—The President be only eligible to hold office for three sessions.

8.—A Standing Committee shall be elected annually to select teams for representative matches.

9.—At the A.G.M. of the League, which shall be held in the month of May, alterations to the Constitution and Rules shall be considered, provided fourteen days' notice has been given to the Secretary, or at a specially summoned meeting, provided 14 days' notice has been given to all Clubs. A two-thirds majority shall carry a motion, each Club shall only have two votes on all matters, and the Chairman shall have a casting vote.

10.—The Balance Sheet presented at the A.G.M. by the Treasurer shall have been passed by the Auditors, who shall be elected annually.

11.—The Executive Committee shall conduct all business of the League. It shall have power to deal with any player or Club violating the Rules. Members of the Committee shall retire if their Clubs are involved, but they shall be entitled to be heard on the subject; fifteen shall form a quorum provided each Division be represented, and a bare majority shall carry a motion.

12.—Each Club shall play home and away matches with every Club in their Division except as in Rule 36. Points shall be awarded as follows—Two points for a win, one point for a draw.

13.—All matches must be for four couples mixed doubles, and to be played as in American Tourna-

ments, each couple to play one game of fifteen aces (all games to change at eight aces) with each couple of the opponents. If after two and a half hours play the match is unfinished the result of the games played will be taken as the final score, and points awarded accordingly, but should the home Club receive an extension of time, the Clubs can by mutual agreement complete the games.

14.—Clubs failing to play as in Rule 13 lose the points, and defaulting Club be held liable for half expenses; the maximum half expenses to be four shillings.

15.—All matches shall be played according to the laws of the game as approved by the Scottish Badminton Union, with the exception that the minimum size of the court be 40 ft. in length and 18 ft. in breadth.

16.—In the event of Clubs tying for the League Championship or for relegation, games will determine the positions, and in the event of games being equal aces will determine the positions.

17.—Two Clubs will be promoted and two relegated; this to apply to the respective Divisions.

18.—All players taking part in League Competitions must be registered three clear days before playing in same. No registration form will be accepted unless accompanied by a fee of one shilling (1/-), which must be sent to the League Treasurer. This fee includes copy of League Handbook. Registrations are valid for one season.

19.—The home and away Clubs shall each have an Umpire who shall umpire the games. Linesmen

are essential for each game. The Clubs to make their own arrangements regarding same.

20.—Play in all matches must commence not later than thirty minutes after recognised starting time. Clubs failing to observe will forfeit the points.

21.—In all League matches the Secretary of the Home Club must complete the score sheet and return same to the Assistant Secretary not later than the day after the match.

22.—League fixtures can only be altered with the sanction of the League Secretary, provided seven days' notice has been given stating reasons. In cases of emergency, where seven days' notice has been found impossible, a written statement from the Management of the Church, stating that the hall is not available, will be deemed sufficient reason for the postponement of the fixture.

23.—Any Club playing a player under an assumed name, an unregistered player, or an ineligible player, will lose the game and be fined two points in addition.

24.—(a) A player taking part in one match for a Club in this League shall be bound to that Club unless officially transferred.

(b) No Club shall sign a player of another Club who has played in one game for that Club unless the said Club agree to transfer. In transfer an official form must be used.

(c) All transfers must meet with the approval of the Executive Committee.

(d) No player be transferred after 31st December of each playing season.

25.—No players can be registered after 31st January each playing season.

26.—The home Club must provide four regulation shuttlecocks; if a less number than this is provided, and the Umpire considers that they are unplayable, and the game cannot go on, the home Club loses both points.

27.—All League games must commence not later than two and a half hours before the recognised closing time of the hall.

28.—Should any question arise which is not provided for by the Constitution and Rules, the Committee shall have power to determine same.

29.—On a requisition signed by half the representatives of the Clubs in the League a special meeting must be called.

30.—In the event of a Club failing to fulfil an arranged League fixture without the sanction of the League Secretary, such Club shall be held liable for expenses. The Committee shall have power to inflict a fine on Clubs failing to fulfil their arranged fixtures.

31.—A Committee of seven (with powers to add further members if desired) shall be elected annually to make all arrangements for tournaments and to be responsible for carrying through same.

32.—The President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be *ex-officio* members of all committees.

33.—The names and addresses of Match Secretary, two League representatives, and location of hall shall be notified in writing to the League

Secretary with the payment of annual subscription. Any change in above should be intimated at once.

35.—The Secretary of home Club must write Secretaries of visiting Clubs, who must receive notice not later than three clear days before the match, explaining the location of the hall and the best way of reaching same.

36.—Where the Divisions consist of eleven Clubs, each Club will play each other once, each Club having five home and five away fixtures, which will be balloted.

37.—The official playing season of the League will be from 1st October till 14th March.

38.—League fixtures must be completed by 14th March otherwise the defaulting Clubs will lose the points.

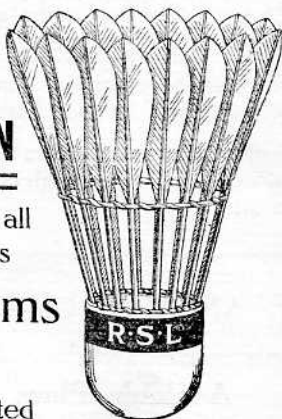

SECRETARY'S REPORT. 17

Season 1935-36.

PROGRESS.

For the sixth session in succession I have again to report the further strengthening of our organisation. Each season has seen our League add to its strength, and we have now in membership 44 clubs, a remarkable achievement in such a brief period.

LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The First Division Championship has been won for the second time by Alexandra Parade from Wellfield, who finish runners-up. Duntocher West emerge worthy winners of the Second Division. In the tussle for the Third Division honours, St. Columba's, Eastern Y.M.C.A. and Rockvilla tied in points, and St. Columba's gained the honour by the narrow margin of one game. Duntocher East had the distinction of winning the Fourth Division without the loss of a game. To each of these Clubs I extend my congratulations on their achievements.

RESERVE DIVISIONS.

The Reserve Division has proved indeed popular, and the success is due to Mr. Maxwell's efforts. In the play-off a fine sporting game was witnessed with Newton Mearns emerging narrow winners from St. David's. This division has done much to encourage the younger players, and I hope this happy state of affairs will long continue.

TREASURER'S RESIGNATION.

During the season our Treasurer, Miss A Goldie, had to relinquish the post for business reasons, this being accepted with great regret. To Miss Goldie, for her unremitting attention in taking charge of our finances, we were indeed indebted, and I express my sincere thanks and appreciation.

INTERIM TREASURER'S STATEMENT.

We have been indeed fortunate in a successor, as has been heard from our Interim Treasurer's Report. Miss McKenzie has proved a worthy successor, and I hope we may have her help in taking charge of our finances for many seasons to come.

INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.

The Individual Championships received excellent support, this being due to the kindness of Lt.-Commander J. T. Bostock-Hill in granting us the use of the R.N.V.R. Drill Hall, which is ideal for the carrying out of this important event. The standard of play has improved greatly, and many surprises were witnessed before the final stages were reached. The winners of the Championships were:—Mixed Doubles: Miss C. Reid and Mr. C. R. Lyall, Martyrs' Parish gained the honours, and hold the Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Martin Trophy, this being the only individual honour that has not been won twice. Miss C. Reid and Miss E. Boa of Martyrs' Parish won the Ladies' Doubles for the third year in succession. In the Men's Doubles, R. B. Topping and H. McIntosh retained their Championship, as did Miss C. Reid in the Ladies' Singles. In the Men's Singles, J. Wilson, Alexandra Parade, regained the title. To Miss Reid falls the added distinction of being the first player to gain triple honours in the Championships.

REPRESENTATIVE GAMES.

For the fourth year in succession we had again to admit defeat by a large margin to the Edinburgh Churches. While this Annual reverse is very disappointing, I feel sure that after this year's display we have reason to feel hopeful, as the high standard of play augurs well for the future.

Against the Milngavie League we had a good win, thus reversing our narrow defeat last year.

We added to our list of representative games, Greenock Churches, the first game being played at Greenock. The match created great interest, and a large and appreciative audience packed "Seaview," where many close and exciting games were witnessed. Greenock emerged worthy winners at the finish.

ANNUAL CHURCH SERVICE.

Our second Annual Church Service, which was held in Alexandra Parade Methodist Church, received encouraging support. To the Rev. W. Murray Mackay, Newton Mearns, we are indebted for conducting the service which was greatly appreciated.

"SWAN TROPHY."

In the preliminary rounds of the "Swan Trophy" many close and exciting games were seen. A fitting climax was reached at the Semi-Finals and Finals in the R.N.V.R. Drill Hall, where Martyr's Parish defeated the holders, Duntocher West, by the odd rubber.

The concluding stages of the Reserve Knock-out Competition were also played off, and Newton Mearns gained the honour by defeating Alexandra Parade Methodist in the final.

It is very gratifying to know that, as a result of the collections at these games, we are in a position to hand over a nice sum to Charity.

SOCIAL ACTIVITIES.

The social activities received encouraging support from the clubs with one exception—the Annual Presentation Dance. While I have no doubt that a National Sporting event kept many away, I was keenly disappointed that as many as fifteen clubs had no representative present. This is the first social function in which a loss has been sustained, and while it is a very substantial one, I wish to record my appreciation of the very generous treatment given us by the Halls' Manager of the Glasgow Corporation. Otherwise, our loss might have been trebled.

"BADMINTON MONTHLY."

This season saw the publication of our own Magazine, "Badminton Monthly" under the capable editorship of Mr. D. L. Campbell. The Magazine has been much appreciated by all, and while the circulation aimed at did not reach what the Committee had anticipated, it was indeed encouraging. When mentioning the possibility of such a magazine in my report last year, I had in mind a less ambitious one, but on consideration the Committee decided that if the Magazine was to succeed it must be published along the lines we have seen. This added to the cost, as will be shewn by Miss Walters in her financial statement. In considering the position I feel we must not come to a decision which will in any way retard or threaten the financial stability of the League finances.

To Miss Walters and Mr. Campbell, the Committee, and all who have assisted in the publication of the

"Badminton Monthly" we are deeply grateful for their efforts on our behalf.

HALL FUND.

The decision to inaugurate a "Hall Fund" I feel to be a step which will further strengthen our organisation, and when the necessary amount is available, we will not hesitate to secure an annual let of a suitable hall in which to further extend our activities.

I believe that if each and every Club, and every player assisted, we could accomplish this task before the end of another season. I sincerely hope that I may count on the support of everyone, and thus further the strength and enthusiasm in Churches Badminton.

APPRECIATION.

To Burnbank, London Road and Alexandra Parade Methodist Churches we are indebted for the use of their halls, also Mr. Wallace and Mr. Litster for their efforts in securing the use of West Princes Street Drill Hall. To the members of Burnbank for the able manner in which they looked after the catering at the reception on the occasion of the Inter-City Match, and Mr. Hutchison for his attention to the social part of the proceedings. Mr. Jack has given reliable service to our players at the Tournaments and all other representative games. To all who have assisted in the work of the League I express my sincere thanks. It is very gratifying to know that their services have been given with enthusiasm.

PRESIDENT'S RETIRAL.

Mr. Wright, who was elected President of the League at the A.G.M. three seasons ago, retires from office to-night. During his term of office his vigour, enthusiasm and keenness to further strengthen the League has been in evidence from the beginning, and we are indebted very much for all his labours on our behalf, and I wish also to add my own appreciation. It has been a very great pleasure to carry through our many activities with the unstinted and loyal support of Mr. Wright. He has been a competent servant of the League, and although he retires from office, I hope that we may long have his assistance.

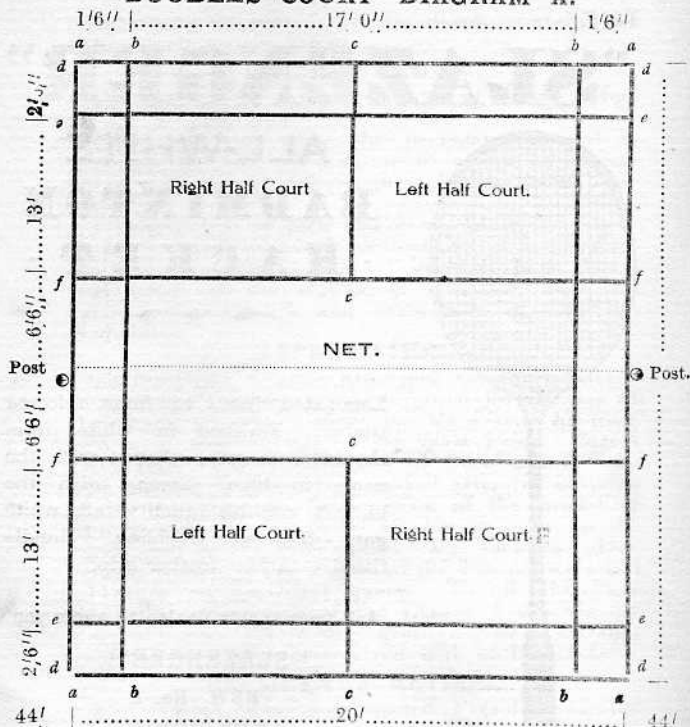

e. *e.* Long Service Line for Doubles.

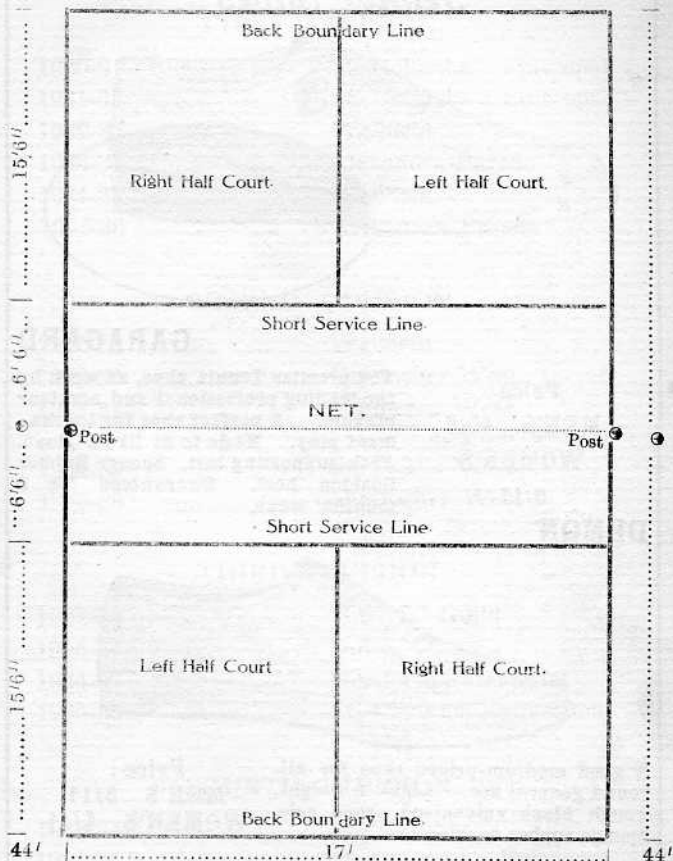
f. *f.* Short Service Line.

NOTES.—(1) The posts shall be placed on the side boundary lines of the Court.

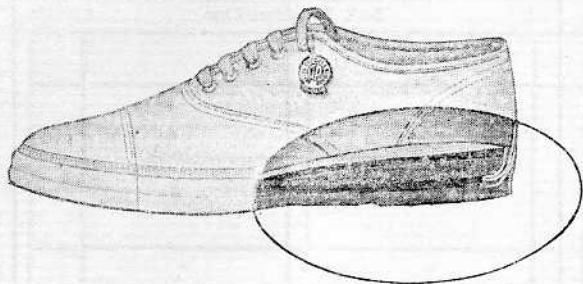
(2) Where it is not possible for the posts to be placed on the side boundary lines, some method must be employed for indicating the position of the side boundary line where it passes under the net (*e.g.*) by the use of a thin post or by a strip of material not less than two inches in width fixed to the side boundary line and rising vertically to the net cord.

NOTE.—Where space does not permit of the marking out of a full size court in accordance with Law No. 1, a court may be marked out for singles play only, and, in that case, the provisions of footnotes (1) and (2) to diagram "A" shall apply to such court. The back boundary lines become also the long service lines.

Rules.

1.—The draw for the first round will contain all Clubs in the League's membership; the ties to be played at the Courts of the first-named Club or elsewhere by mutual agreement between the Clubs.

2.—Home Clubs shall offer opponents two dates within the stipulated date for the tie. Failure to offer two such dates or failure to accept one of these dates will result in disqualification.

3.—Each team will consist of twelve players and each tie of three mixed doubles, one Ladies' doubles, one Gent.'s doubles, one Ladies' and one Gent.'s singles, each game to be a rubber. Players may be placed in the team at the discretion of the clubs.

4.—The shuttlecocks to be supplied by the Home Club, and the away Club to defray half the cost of same.

5.—The League will arrange Semi-Final and Final ties.

6.—As there is no entry fee for this competition, home Clubs will arrange to take a collection at each tie. Such collections after meeting expenses incurred by the League will be devoted to charitable organisations as decided by the members at the Annual General Meeting of the League.

7.—In the event of a Club withdrawing, they should notify opponents and League Secretary.

8.—Immediately on date being fixed for tie the Home Club must inform League Secretary.

9.—Captains of Teams must hand copy of their respective teams and placings to each other prior to the commencement of the tie.

10.—Home Secretary must forward copy of both teams together with complete result of the tie so as to reach the League Secretary the following day.

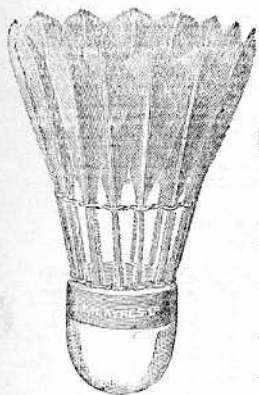

HINTS TO UMPIRES.

Linesmen should be instructed only to call when the shuttle is out of play.

Watch the fall of the shuttle if it is not taken.

Watch for a "let."

Watch that the striker does not leave his court before the service is delivered.

Remember that a player who strikes a shuttle before it passes the net, or who, before the shuttle is dead, touches the net or its supports with racket, person or clothes, loses the point.

When a score at which setting is permissible is reached, ask the player who first reached that score whether he wishes to set.

Remember that it is your opinion that is to lead you to a decision, not that of the players, still less that of the spectators.

If you cannot give a decision do not be afraid to say so; in such a case, accept the opinion of the players if they are agreed, otherwise you must give a let.

Give your decisions as promptly as possible, but remember that over-anxiety to be smart may lead you into error.

Call the score clearly at the end of each rally, and loudly enough to be heard by spectators as well as players.

Where a linesman is appointed, his decision on all points relative to the line is absolutely final.
