You'll enjoy seeing

- Mrs. NAN BISSETT (Glasgow).**—One of the younger members of the Association who in the short space of three seasons has come right to the forefront. Holder of two Championships and winner of two events in our Invitation Tournament, a grand doubles player with a keen sense of position.
- Mrs. A. M. HORNER (Scotland).**—Always one of Scotland's representatives in an International team. Best game is undoubtedly Mixed Doubles. May lack power but more than compensates for this with courtcraft.
- Mrs. M. ROBERTSON (Scotland).**—A leading player in Lanarkshire Badminton. Received a well-deserved honour this year by representing Scotland. A strong Mixed Doubles player.
- Mrs. JOY SAUNDERS (England).**—In addition to being "capped" for England, plays for County—Cheshire. Holder of the Irish Open Mixed Doubles and Scottish Open Mixed Doubles titles in company with Johnny Heah. "Mixed" is obviously her strong point.
- A. C. FLETCHER (Greenock).**—On several occasions "Archie" has been Reserve for Scotland. Well known and leading player in "West" Badminton. A good stroke player.
- D. B. GREEN (Ireland).**—Has been a regular recipient of honours for his country since the War. Has held Irish Restricted Mixed and Men's Doubles titles. Strong Mixed Doubles player.
- A. D. JORDAN (Cheshire).**—At 18 years of age, one of England's young "hopes." Hails from Cheshire and plays for his County. Has taken part in All England Junior Championships, only illness prevented a title coming his way. Partnered by his mother, Mrs. Eleanor Jordan, flashed into the Wimbledon limelight by vanquishing the formidable E. L. Choong and Miss Windsor-Aubrey. Lost to Johnny Heah in the Final at the recent "Scottish."
- A. MacINTYRE (Scotland).**—A Scottish "cap" since 1949 and has held Scottish Restricted Singles and presently holds the East Singles title. One of Scotland's "Thomas Cup" representatives in 1949. A powerful player, especially in Mixed Doubles.
- W. A. ROBINSON (Scotland).**—Capped this year for Scotland. Has played for Cheshire for many years and holds Northern Mixed Doubles Championship, beating Johnny Heah in the Final. Produces delightful attacking strokes.
- DONALD ROSS (Scotland).**—First introduced to representative Badminton in 1950, his game has developed tremendously. This season he has been capped against England and Ireland and has reached the Final in several of the major tournaments. One of our younger players who with some improvement in the next two years will be a decided asset to Scotland.
- J. A. RUSSELL (Scotland).**—First won the Men's Singles in the "Glasgow" in 1949-50, annexed the East title in 1950-51, and added the Midlands Singles and Men's Doubles. Followed these successes with the Scottish Restricted Singles, which he still holds, and has since added the East "Mixed." Twice capped against England and Ireland, and a member of the Thomas Cup team this year. Among the top flight of British players, especially in Singles.
- JOHN STEVENSON (Glasgow).**—A stalwart in Churches Badminton in the post-war era. Holder of two championship titles and Singles holder for the past three seasons. Last season's winner of the Men's Doubles in the Scottish Restricted and three events in the Dunfermline Open. A strong forceful player with amazing powers of recovery.
